

The North American Rounds will be held at Stetson's Tampa campus on November 7-8. **The field will be strictly limited to sixteen teams.** The top two applicants and top two respondents will advance to the International Finals, which will be held on our Gulfport campus on November 9-10. This year's theme is energy and biodiversity.

We are revising the program slightly. In 2007, each team will argue in four preliminary rounds (three on November 7 and one on November 8). The top-ranked applicant and the top-ranked respondent will then immediately meet in the championship round to determine the winner of the North American Rounds. At the conclusion of this round, we will hold an awards ceremony to announce the winner and the four teams advancing to the International Finals.

The teams advancing from the North American Rounds will meet teams advancing from Australia, Latin America, North and South India, and Southeast Asia.

If you wish to reserve a spot, please send a \$300 registration fee (checks should be out to Stetson University College of Law) to my attention at the address below. If you wish to pay by credit card, please email me, and we will make the necessary arrangements.

**Because the field will be limited to 16 teams on a first-come, first-served basis, I urge you to register as soon as possible.**
