



LOCATING THE LAW FOR ANY STATE ONLINE

The following sites provide excellent compilations of state law resources, both statutes and case law, for all 50 states:

- **AllLaw.com**
(Geographical as well as subject access. Includes some reference sources.)
- **American Law Sources Online** (another very good one for cases and statutes from all states)
- **FindLaw** (A great site for finding cases, statutes, and government sites; owned by Thompson-West)
- **FirstGov Reference Center** (links to state laws, courts, and governments)
- **Google** (don't forget that almost all public domain

With this, and any other topic, remember that not only can you find sources online, you can also find Research Guides which will give you additional assistance in locating materials. For example, if you Google "researching state law," you'll locate a number of research guides.

You can also Google more particular research areas, such as "researching Florida law."

Additionally, you can simply go to a State's website and locate a great deal of information which may be relevant to your research, including legislative history.
