

5.7 Course Selection

Full-time students at the College of Law typically are enrolled in a required curriculum for the first three semesters; part-time students typically are enrolled in a required curriculum for the first five semesters. Thereafter, the student may choose from the elective courses listed and offered, and must complete Evidence and the four area requirements: the administrative law requirement, the code requirement, the skills requirement, and the upper-level writing requirement.

Unless an exception has been approved in writing by the Associate Dean, a student must take required courses, but not Evidence or the area requirements, before registering for electives. By registering for electives, the student represents to the College that he or she has completed, or is concurrently registered in, all remaining required courses, except Evidence or the four area requirements.

As an exception to this general policy, a student who is still in the required curriculum may seek permission from the Associate Dean to enroll during the summer in a Stetson-sponsored summer abroad program, another school's summer abroad program, a condensed summer course offered by Stetson, or a Stetson sponsored judicial internship.
