

## **Credit Overloads During Required Curriculum**

- 1.1 A student in the required first-year curriculum may not take additional courses except in extraordinary circumstances.
- 1.2 The required first-year curriculum refers to “Law I” courses listed in policy 5.10, “Required Curriculum.”
- 1.3 A student in the required first-year curriculum who seeks to take an additional class should submit a request in writing to the Associate Dean of Academics. The request should state the course in which the student hopes to enroll and should explain in detail the reasons why the overload should be granted.
- 1.4 The Associate Dean of Academics, in his or her sole discretion, will determine whether the request should be granted.
- 1.5 If the request is granted, the student must pay for the additional course on a per-credit basis. However if an overload is approved because the student was invited by the College of Law to participate in an honors or co-curricular activity, such as law review, moot court, or the honors program, the student will not have to pay for these additional credits earned while enrolled in the required first-year curriculum.
