



Fee for Bar-Review Course

As a non-academic condition of enrollment, all students enrolled in the full-time or part-time J.D., or J.D. dual- degree programs, and who matriculate in or after the Fall 2009 semester (including all transfer students with an expected graduation date in or after December 2011), will be required to pay a fee for a non-credit bar-review course taught by representatives of a College-approved vendor.

- A. Payment:** The College of Law will collect the fee in two equal installments during a student's first two semesters. The entire fee will be used to purchase the course for the student, at a discount from the price the vendor normally charges for the course. The College of Law will not keep any portion of the fee.

- B. Enrollment in Program:** A student to whom this policy applies will be automatically enrolled in the bar-review course for the appropriate period after he or she graduates. Because the course covers multi-state topics, a student may take the course in a location other than Florida.

- C. Refund:** Under certain limited exceptions, a student may be permitted a refund. These circumstances include withdrawing from the College of Law, being academically excluded from the College of Law, or planning to take only the Washington state bar, which does not include the multi-state examination. An application for refund should be submitted to the Associate Dean of Academics. The application should be in writing and should state the basis for the request.
