



### **Further Required Curriculum**

- This program pertains to all full-time and part-time students who have completed 30 credit hours **and** who are at that point ranked in the bottom 10% of their class **and** who have a cumulative G.P.A. at or below 2.2. The program pertains to students who are academically excluded and readmitted **and** to students with these statistics who were not academically excluded.
- The Academic Standards Committee retains the right to place additional requirements on students who are readmitted following an academic exclusion. The Academic Standards Committee also could grant a petition from a student to be exempted from this “further required curriculum” for good cause shown.
- During the period these students are considered 2A/2B students, they must take the following courses: Evidence; Criminal Procedure (federal); and either Corporations or Family Law.
- During the period these students are considered 3A/3B students, they must take the following courses: either Commercial Transactions or Sales, Leases and Licenses; Remedies; and either Trusts and Estates or Survey of Florida Probate Law.
- Thus, for full-time students, a typical “further required curriculum” schedule might look like this (note: this is just an example; other variations exist; for example, a student could take Evidence in the fourth semester); the “further required” courses are italicized:

#### **Third semester**

*Agency (3)*

*Professional Responsibility (3)*

*Evidence (4)*

**[Evidence already is required, but we would now place it in the second year for these students]**

One or two electives

#### **Fourth semester**

*Corporations or Family Law (3)*

*Criminal Procedure (3)*

Administrative requirement (3)

Skills requirement (3)

One other elective

**Fifth semester**

*Commercial Transactions (4) or Sales, Leases and Licenses (3)*

**[satisfies the Code Requirement]**

*Remedies (3)*

Writing Requirement (1 to 3)

Two other electives

**Sixth semester**

*Trusts and Estates or Survey of Florida Probate (4 or 2)*

Electives

- The selected courses are tested on the Florida bar examination, and are tested on many other bar examinations. They also are on the “highly recommended electives” list that the faculty developed a few years ago. We believe that our lower-ranked students would benefit from being exposed to the substance of these topics before the bar prep courses — so that the bar course will be a review, instead of a challenge to learn a great deal of completely new material.
- The Associate Dean of Academics has the discretion to move classes from the 2L grouping to the 3L grouping for good cause shown.
- This program will be effective with the summer 2004 entrants.
