



### **Maximum J.D. Credit Hours**

- A. Full-time Students:** During the fall and spring semesters, a full-time student may not enroll in more than 17 credit hours, except that the Associate Dean of Academics may allow a student in a dual-degree program to take 18 credits hours in a semester if some credit hours are attempted in courses not offered through the College of Law, such as M.B.A courses offered through the University's School of Business Administration or M.P.H. or M.D. courses offered at the University of South Florida. During the on-campus summer session, a full-time student may not enroll in more than 8 credit hours without the permission of the Associate Dean of Academics, and in no case more than 9.
- B. Part-time Students:** During the fall and spring semesters, a part-time student may not enroll in more than 11 credit hours without the permission of the Associate Dean of Academics and in no case may enroll in more than 12 hours in either of those terms. During the on-campus summer session, a part-time student may not enroll in more than 7 credit hours without the permission of the Associate Dean of Academics, and in no case more than 8 credits.
